Monday, May 8th

2021 IRC Code Update with Washington State Amendments

This course will cover some of the significant changes from the 2018 International Residential Code (IRC) to the current 2021 IRC. This includes changes to opening protection, safety glazing, thermal barriers, footing requirements, retaining walls, decks, fastener schedule, wall bracing, emergency egress, etc.

Tuesday, May 9th

2021 IBC / 2017 ICC A117.1 Accessibility

This course focuses on the Residential accessibility update of the IBC and ICC A117.1. It covers requirements for commercial and residential buildings (excluding dwelling units) and highlights new provisions from the 2017 ICC A117.1 Standard. The course includes a discussion of accessibility requirements for existing structures undergoing additions, alterations, or change of use. Accessible means of egress requirements from Chapter 10 of the IBC are also included in this response.

2021 Washington State Energy Code – Residential Code Updates

Join WSU's Energy Program's Jonathan P. Jones, as he presents on the upcoming Washington State's Residential Energy (WSEC-R) code. The 2021 WSEC-R will be in effect on July 1, 2023. WSU's Energy Program seminar focuses on significant changes to the energy code (both to the base code and options categories in the R-406) and commonly misunderstood requirements. This course is ideal for building department staff, builders, contractors, architects, energy consultants, and any other building industry professionals who wish to gain a proficient understanding of this code.



Jonathan P Jones leads the energy code technical assistance team and the Home Energy Raters team for the WSU Energy Program. Among his responsibilities in these roles, Jones creates and delivers trainings about the energy code for a wide audience across Washington and manages the Home Energy Rater Provider Services Program. His experience as a general contractor, real estate appraiser and broker, and design/drafting specialist for contractors gives him an authentic, real-world perspective that our clients appreciate. 2021 International Building Code (IBC) Update

This class will provide a brief synopsis of some of the key changes from the 2018 International Building Code to the 2021 version. The class will focus on significant changes made to nonstructural provisions (i.e. Chapters 1-16 and 24-33), the structural provisions (i.e. Chapters 16-23), and will also highlight some of the changes made to the referenced standards. Information will be provided on new construction type and Cross-Laminated Timber (CLT) requirements as well as other significant changes in the code.
